#### All items must be clean, dry, and broken down to be accepted

#### **NOT ACCEPTED**

•Soiled, wet, or contaminated cardboard

- •Newspaper
- •Bagged shredded paper
- •Non-corrugated cardboard & paperboard -Ex. cereal, soda can, tissue boxes, etc.

•Brown kraft paper and paper bags

## NOT ACCEPTED

•Papers with binder clips, paper clips, or spiral binding. Please remove these items prior to recycling.

- •Paper towels, tissues, napkins
- •Paper plates and coffee cups •Soiled or wet paper

•Plastic items #1, 2, and 5 including clean and dry plastic beverage bottles and cups and clear clamshell containers

### NOT ACCEPTED

Styrofoam products
Motor oil or chemical containers
Plastic plates or silverware
Plastic grocery bags
K-cups or food wrappers
